

Prof. Alexey Maslov is one of the leading Russian scholars and expert in East Asian studies. He received Ph.D. from the Institute of Far Eastern Studies under Russian Academy of Science. His recent researches include "Changing of political values in modern East Asia", "Comparative studies of East-West intellectualism", "Local religious communities in modern China", "East-West: contacts and conflicts", "Confucius: new translations and new meanings".

Prof. Maslov is the most widely published scholar in East Asian studies in Russia and published more than 20 books, some of which are Bells in the Dust: Spiritual quest and sacral ecstasy in China (Aleteya, 2003, 2005), Taming a dragon: Wanderings of mystic and intellectual in China (Aleteya, 2003, 2005), East-West: History of the Relations and Conflicts in the Modern World (Moscow, 2009), Chinese Secret Societies in the Political Culture of China of 20 c. (Institute of Far Eastern Studies, 1993); Inconstancy of the Eternity: Lao-zi: Myth, Man, and His Book. (Edwin Mellen Press, 1999), Scriptures on the Water: the Genesis of Buddhist Mysticism in China (Sphere Press, 1999), etc.
